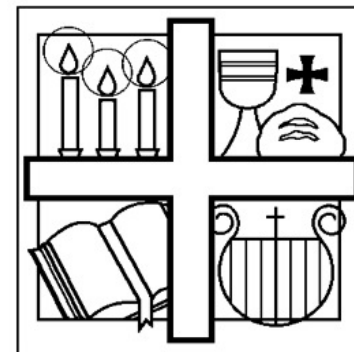

"And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name'" (Luke 1:46-49).

Today we remember Mary, innocent and powerful, sacred and scared, worried and waiting as the Savior of all grows in her womb. A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

The ministry of the Church extends to God's children of every age and we at Berea Friendship are blessed to be able to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with young and old alike. But in today's world we must always be aware of issues of safety when caring for children, youth, and vulnerable adults. That's why our South Carolina Conference has required all United Methodist Churches in our state to adopt a "Safe Sanctuary Policy" outlining our safety measures in our ministries with the young and/or vulnerable. This policy includes a mandate to secure criminal background checks on all church volunteers who work with children, youth, and vulnerable adults. As your pastor, I, too, am subject to regular criminal background checks as a way of ensuring we are taking appropriate steps to maintain high standards of safety for those who worship God in our local churches. If you are a volunteer with children, youth, or vulnerable adults, please fill out the necessary paperwork as required by our Berea Friendship policy.

Our Safe Sanctuary Coordinator, Nancy Neal, will provide you with a packet of information to complete this process. Return the three required forms to Nancy as soon as possible. Be assured that background checks are completely confidential and will be held secure. Also, if you would like to schedule a time to talk with me about our safety measures or any concerns you may have, please call.

We are implementing this Safe Sanctuary Policy for the safety of all members and while it is somewhat inconvenient, we believe it will help us ensure a place of safety for all who participate in the ministries of Berea Friendship United Methodist Church.
